

TOPIC: Chinese Medicine Treatment for Parkinson's Disease

Dr. Huang has been an Instructor at PCOM since 2002, as well as Supervisor in the Student Clinic. A graduate of Chengdu College of TCM in 1983, Dr. Huang pursued post-graduate studies in TCM until 1986. For the next eight years in China, he ran a private clinic, practicing acupuncture and herbal medicine. Emigrating to the USA in 1993, he became director of research and development of new herbal formulae, for a US-based herb company. Before coming to San Diego, he taught for five years at the 'International Institute of Chinese Medicine' in Santa Fe.
