

## Herb Prescription Strategies Based on the Five Zang Organs - Part 2:

The compatibility of Chinese herbal medicines occupies an extremely important position in both the theoretical framework and clinical practice of TCM, particularly when grounded in the five-element theory centered on the Five Zang organs: The rational, precise and targeted formulation and application of herbal prescriptions can achieve greatly enhanced clinical outcomes. This lecture will focus on the physiological and pathological characteristics of the five Zang organs, with emphasis on the principles, methods, and distinctive features of herb treatment, for each organ. Special attention will be given to clinically common and effective herbal compatibilities -- which will be further illustrated and substantiated through a large number of clinical cases.
